1. Club Entries

1.1 General Entries

Entries are invited from all Clubs throughout Australia and the World for the events as listed under Item 4. The method of entry is via the Surfmate Carnival Program for all Queensland Clubs. The Seniors and Masters events will be named as separate carnivals on Carnival Manager. The name of the Senior Carnival is 2010 Queensland Senior Championships and The Masters Carnival is 2010 Queensland Masters Championships.

Clubs without access to Surfmate (ONLY those Clubs outside of Queensland) may enter via the manual entry form attached to this document or contact Sarah Hesse (SLSQ Surf Sports Administration Assistant) on 07-3846 8017 or shesse@lifesaving.com.au and returned directly to:

Only faxed entries with credit card details will be permitted otherwise original hard copy manual entry form with a bank or Surf Life Saving Club cheque will be permitted.

NB: No personal cheques will be accepted and all interstate and international entries must be submitted with Branch (where applicable) and State or Country endorsement.

Entries for this event close at Midnight, Sunday 14th February 2010.

Late Entries for this event will close at 5pm on Monday 22nd February 2010

1.2 Entry Fees

All interstate entries must be accompanied by a Club or Bank Cheque made out to Surf Life Saving Queensland to cover the Entry Fee of \$44.00 (inc GST) per competitor.

A Tax Invoice for all entries (including late/ additional entries) will be issued to all Queensland clubs by 11th March 2010.

Please Note:

March Past teams will only be charged an entry fee of \$50.00 per team.

1.3 Entry Conditions

All Competitors wishing to compete at the 2010 Crazy Johns Queensland Masters and Senior Championships must have their Bronze Medallion (or Surf Rescue Certificate if an Under 15 Competitor), by the close of entries on Sunday 14th February 2010, to be eligible to compete at the 2010 Crazy John's Queensland Masters and Seniors Surf Life Saving Championships.

All Competitors must have completed their relevant club award Proficiency Test by 31st December 2009. Those members gaining their Surf Rescue Certificate and Bronze Medallion during the 2009/2010 season, prior to close of entries will be considered as satisfying the proficiency requirements for entry to these Championships.

All competitors must have completed the minimum 25 hours of beach patrol duties as random checks on patrol hours and proficiency status will be carried out after close of entries Sunday 14th February 2009.

All competitors must have completed and signed the Association Application for Membership Form and paid any required membership fees.

It is mandatory that ALL COMPETITORS (including reel party members of belt teams) are entered via Surfmate (except for those Clubs outside of Queensland, who must list them on the Manual Club Entry Form)

NOTE:

It is an offence to enter a person who does not meet any of the above requirements, and any irregularities will be considered by the State Surf Sports Committee.

1.4 Penalties

Entry of competitors who are ineligible due to non qualification of proficiency, default or personal patrol hour obligations, or other breach of Association or Club entry regulations may have penalties provided for as follows:

The penalty for breach of entry regulations for the 2010 "Crazy Johns" Queensland Masters and Seniors Surf Life Saving Championships will be the automatic rejection of entries for those persons found to be in breach of regulations and the forfeiture of their entry fees.

Application of the automatic penalty will not preclude further disciplinary action by the association against Clubs or other persons if deemed appropriate in the case of serious attempt to defeat Association regulations.

2. Late Entries

Nominations which are received at Surf Life Saving Queensland after Sunday 14th February 2009 will incur a late entry fee of \$150.00 (inc GST) – (\$44.00 entry fee plus late entry fee of \$150.00 inc GST- total late entry fee = \$194.00 inc GST) per person.

Any changes or additions to ORIGINAL nominations (ie additional events for person who have already nominated in original club entries and paid the entry fee) should be advised to Sarah Hesse in writing at Surf Life Saving Queensland no later than, Monday 22nd February 2010.

Any additional events or late entries received after this date will not be accepted.

Late nominations (which will incur the late entry fee) and/or additional event nominations to original entries for both Masters and Seniors will not be accepted after COB Monday 22nd February 2010.

3. Cancellation Policy

The following Cancellation fee and Refund Policy will be adhered to:

- If a carnival is cancelled, with no postponement before the first event is conducted, 75% of all entry fees will be refunded to all Clubs (25% retained for administration costs)
- If a carnival is cancelled, after the first event is conducted, no refund will be given
- If a carnival is postponed and rescheduled to another date, a 75% refund will be issued to competing Clubs that cannot compete at the re-scheduled event.

5. Notes on Events

5.1. Timetable of Events

The draft timetable of events for the 2010 Crazy John's Queensland Masters and Seniors Championships will be issued to all participating clubs on Monday 15th February 2010.

All events for the 2010 "Crazy Johns" Queensland Masters State Championships will be conducted on Friday 5th March 2010 at Kurrawa Beach – ocean conditions permitting.

The beach event program for Under 15, Under 17, Under 19 and Open athletes will be run on Saturday 6th March 2010 at Kurrawa Beach.

The water event program (individual and team events) for the 2010 "Crazy Johns" Queensland Senior State Championships will be conducted on Saturday 6th March and Sunday 7th March 2010 at Kurrawa Beach – ocean conditions permitting.

All Surf Boat events (Masters, Under 19, Under 23 and Open) will be conducted on Saturday 6th March 2010 with all relevant Surf Boat finals to be conducted on Sunday 7th March 2010 if required.

All R&R events will be conducted and completed starting from 7.30am on Saturday 6th March 2010 at Kurrawa Beach.

The March Past event will be conducted at 8am (sharp) on Sunday 7th March 2010 as the opening event for "Finals Day" at the 2010 "Crazy Johns" Queensland State Championships.

A final timetable will be issued with the final carnival bulletin to all participating clubs and also placed on the SLSQ website on Wednesday 24th February 2010. Some minor changes may occur to the final timetable over the course of the Championships.

5.2. Masters Surf Boat Events

Age categories will be determined by adding the ages of the four rowers. Gender specific and open events

5.3. Masters Team Events

Age limits of 3 person team races have four divisions of 110 years, 130 years, 150 years and 170 years. The age categories of Beach Relays will be in three divisions of 140 years, 170 years, 200 years and 230 years. Unless specified as Male or Female events they will be classed as mixed or open gender events.

6. Competition Conditions

Competition conditions for all events are set out in the 33rd Edition SLSA Surf Sports Manual and any amending or clarifying Bulletins and as listed below.

The conditions for both the 6 person and 5 person R&R events are detailed in the 28th Edition of the Rescue and Resuscitation Competition Manual (revised November 1999) and any subsequent Bulletins.

Team Changes

Any team changes shall be notified to the marshalls prior to the start of the preceding event.

If decals are used to identify placegetters in any race then the decals shall be presented to the recorders immediately following their issue.

6.1. Water Safety – Compulsory

As all Clubs would be aware, water safety is a vital activity in any carnival and without water safety, carnivals do not happen.

The Top Ten clubs by competitor entry will be required to supply a fully equipped IRB for Water safety at the 2010 "Crazy Johns" Qld State Championships.

Some Clubs shall also be required to provide IRB Drivers depending upon the number of entries – a roster will be issued in February. These drivers shall be extra to the team of drivers that operate during the regular branch and state run events.

The number of competitors will be calculated as Masters plus Seniors

NOTE: The IRB's supplied by Clubs are for the full duration of the Championships (Friday to Sunday) and must be fully operational. Defective craft will be rejected and the Club made to replace it before they compete. IRB's must be delivered to the IRB compound by no later than 4pm on Thursday 4th March 2010.

NOTE: The above requirements may change after the final entry numbers have been collated. All clubs are asked to note that Late Entries **WILL** be included and therefore may change your requirements.

Clubs that fail to comply with this request will result in their Club not competing for that duration of time that the Club takes to supply the IRB or Driver or find a replacement IRB if their own is deemed unseaworthy.

Entries close with Surf Life Saving Queensland at midnight on Sunday 14th February 2010. Late entries will be charged from Monday 15th February 2010 through until close of late entries at 5pm on Monday 22nd February 2010. No late or additional entries will be accepted after this date.

7.2 Scrutineering

Scrutineering at these championships will be conducted randomly throughout this event by appointed scrutineering officials

10. Commercial and other Identification on Apparel and Equipment

The SLSQ Surf Sports Officer, Surf Sports Manager, Championship Referee, Area Referees, Sectional Referees and Chief Scrutineer, reserve the right to enforce the following at the 2010 “Crazy Johns” Queensland Surf Life Saving Championships

No competitor shall be required to carry either the carnival naming rights or individual event sponsors identification on vest, except where specified below (Note 1). Competitors will be required to carry sponsor's logos/identification on craft/boat/equipment and body (tattoos) except where specified below (Note 2). Where physically possible, no signage will be covered.

- i) All Competitors in Championship events may be asked to wear naming rights sponsor's vests for televised semi finals and finals. In the event of a conflict with an existing Club sponsor, then SLSQ branded lycras shall be worn.
- ii) Those craft/persons with rival sponsors to the carnival/event naming rights sponsor will not be required to display the carnival/event sponsors signage and/or to cover the rival sponsor's signage.

Boards

The front deck of boards will be the event sponsors signage area where a 33cm x 33cm (approx) decal, etc, may be placed and the remainder of the surface area will be the Clubs.

Skis

The front deck of skis will be the event sponsors signage area where a 33cm x 33cm (approx) decal, etc, may be placed and the remainder of the surface area will be the Clubs.

Surf Boats

A space 150cm x 30cm above the waterline on both sides of the boat.

NOTE: If the designated spaces are not available or practical due to existing signage, then the naming rights/event sponsors signage will be placed on any suitable alternative spaces.

Vests/Singlet's/Full Costumes

A Club can display its own sponsor's signage on vests, singlets or costumes once only, in a space not exceeding 15cm by 15cm.

Full Costumes

In this context, means women's costumes or R&R and March Past style costumes. Again, a club sponsor may be displayed once only in an area not exceeding 15cm x 15cm.

Male Costumes

Club sponsors can be shown once only on an area on the costumes not exceeding 15cm x 15cm.

March Past Banners

Club sponsors can be shown once only on the banner in an area not exceeding 25cm x 25cm.

Body Tattoos

Club sponsors can be shown once only on the body and limbs not exceeding 15cm x 5cm



SPECIAL NOTICE TO ALL CLUB SECRETARIES & TEAM MANAGERS

CARNIVAL ENTRIES 2010 CRAZY JOHN'S QUEENSLAND STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

At various meetings of the State Centre, reports of misbehaviour at surf Carnivals have been noted with grave concern. The Australian Council has resolved that each Team Manager be notified by special notice of his/her obligations and responsibilities to his/her club, and to Surf Life Saving Australia.

It is an express condition of acceptance of Club entries for the State Championships that the Club's Team Manager signs the attached form, verifying that he/she has read and will do everything in his/her power to comply with this notice. Each Club is now requested to ensure the following items and conditions are implemented:

1. It is mandatory that ALL competing Club Team Managers attend the Team Managers Briefings for both the Masters and Senior Championships
2. The Club Team Managers will have to be fully aware of his/her responsibilities whilst in charge of the team, and that he/she has read and is aware of the "SLSA Membership Protection Policy" and the "SLSQ Codes of Conduct"
3. Each Club traveling to the State Championships shall have a Team manager duly appointed by the Club in resolution or action.
4. The Team Manager shall be held responsible to the Club and to the SLSA for the conduct of all his/her team members in traveling to, during, and returning home from the State Championships.
5. Any group of two or more members who depart the main body of the team (for purposes of travel or any other reason, shall have a sub-manager appointed by the Team Manager for the duration of their departure.
6. Team Managers shall, at all times, exercise control over their teams and ensure member's conduct and appearance does not have an adverse bearing upon the good name of his/her Club or the Association.
7. Special care is to be exercised at high density congregation points, especially air or bus terminals and during the drip. Air Navigation orders lay down procedures as regards to intoxication, interference to air crews, disorderly or offensive behaviour, and any act that threatens the safety of the air craft. Any person contravening his/her order is guilty of an offence.
8. Before departing your accommodation point – the Team manager shall conduct an inspection of the rooms accompanied by the Manager, and preferably a senior member of the team. It shall be confirmed that no complaints are being made, nor will be made re the team's conduct or conditions of accommodation fixtures.
9. A report shall be furnished to the Club by the Team Manager immediately following the completion of the Championships (within 14 days) and report any misconduct or complaint.
10. Team Managers should be cautious of the exchange of team uniforms during or at the Carnival, as mis-reporting of incidents may occur.
11. Remember that the venue of the State Championships is the traditional support base for local Clubs and any misconduct will certainly be noticed and jeopardize future activities of those Clubs. You can readily imagine the situation applied in reverse.
12. A Championship Judiciary Committee will hold itself ready for a meeting in the event of any complaint. Such Committee's shall have the power to also act at the time and shall have jurisdiction over any Lifesaver attending the State Championships or associated Carnivals held at that time.
13. Team Managers are to wear shirts that clearly identify the person as the Club Team Manager. Any person who does not have clothing that shows this will not be given access to the competition area.

2010 CRAZY JOHN'S QUEENSLAND SURF LIFE SAVING CHAMPIONSHIPS ADDITIONAL SPECIAL NOTICE TO ALL CLUB SECRETARIES AND TOURING TEAM MANAGERS

Whilst the news media has been quick to publicly expose acts of unacceptable behaviour by various sporting groups traveling away from their Clubs, legal action by victims of sexual discrimination and harassment has also been threatened. Under the circumstances, it is hoped that Team Managers will accept the following recommendations in the right vein and ensure that the rights of members and the good name of Surf Life Saving Queensland and its traditions are upheld at all times. It is realized that "mixed teams" are common-place these days and that members tend to "let their hair down" after the Championships. However, this should be done within the bounds of good behaviour and not at the expense of the enjoyment and respect of others. Each Club is requested to ensure that the following actions and conditions are implemented.

1. Before Departure

- a) Each group of two or more Club members traveling to the Queensland Championships shall have a Team Manager duly appointed by the Club by resolution or action.
- b) That Team Managers shall be responsible to the Club and to Surf Life Saving Queensland for the conduct of all of their team members in traveling to, during and returning home from the Queensland Championships.
- c) Any group of two or more members who depart the main body of the team for the purposes of travel or for any other reason, shall have a "sub-manager" appointed by the Team Manager for the duration of their departure.
- d) Team Managers shall at all times exercise control over their teams and ensure their conduct and appearance does not have an adverse bearing upon the good name of their Club or Surf Life Saving Queensland
- e) Members who wish to depart the main body and remain in an area or proceed with independent travel arrangements, at the conclusion of the carnival, should give sufficient prior notice to their Club and secure the Club and Team Manager's permission. Clubs are urged to have a policy attitude towards such breaking up of teams at the conclusion of the carnival. In the case of members under the age of 18 years, Clubs should secure a clear indication of approval of such actions from parents or guardians.

2. Travel

- a) Special care should be taken at high density congregation points especially air terminals and during flight trips. Airlines have received instructions regarding the permissible conduct of groups as laid down by the Australian Government Department of Transport. Extract of such instruction states:

"Air Navigation Orders" state in part

Note: A person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations or who attempts to commit an offence against these Regulations is guilty of an offence.

- b) Before departing your accommodation point, the Team Manager and another senior member of the team should conduct an inspection of the rooms accompanied by the Hotel/Motel Manager. It should be confirmed that no complaints are being made, nor will be made (re the team's conduct or condition of the accommodation fixtures).

3. Sexual Harassment

It is difficult to make an exhaustive list of the forms that sexual harassment can take, however, the conduct must be sexual, unwelcome and uninvited. This includes: unwanted physical contact; verbal comments or abuse and/or offensive gestures and depending upon the circumstances, be considered unlawful. Allegations of sexual harassment can arouse strong emotions and if a claim is found to be true, serious consequences can follow.

- a) Team Managers should make it clear to all members that sexual harassment will not be tolerated under any circumstances.
- b) Complaints must be treated seriously and sympathetically
- c) Investigation of complaints must be strictly confidential and impartial
- d) Investigations should be made promptly after complaints are lodged
- e) All parties involved should be interviewed separately to obtain an accurate detail of the incident
- f) Where a complaint is substantiated, appropriate conciliatory or disciplinary action should be taken
- g) Following this decision, later checks should be made to ensure that the behaviour has stopped and the complainant is not being victimized as a result of the complaint.

4. General

- a) Clubs are requested to ensure that their Team Manager's report is speedily received after the Championships and any report of misconduct is appropriately and immediately dealt with.
- b) Extreme caution is suggested in the subject of exchanging of club's identified garments and, in fact, clubs are urged to instruct their members of a policy in this subject. Many incidents have been recorded of misconduct being attributed to a particular club whereas it has been another person wearing their garments.
- c) Please remember that the venue of the Queensland Championships are the traditional support bases of a great many local clubs and misconduct will certainly be noticed and jeopardise future activities of those clubs. You can readily imagine the situation applied in reverse.
- d) It should be noted that a Judiciary Committee will be formed and will be ready for an urgent meeting in the event of any complaint. Such Committee will have the power to also act at that time and shall have jurisdiction over any lifesaver attending the Queensland Championships.
- e) Clubs are urged to ensure that clear policies are in place in respect to touring with members under the age of 18 years and that appropriate arrangements are made with parents/guardians prior to departure and that appropriate supervision is in place at all times.
